The King visited a big Canadian Camp somewhere in Britain to present colours to two Canadian Regiments. The occasion was Dominion Day --- Canada's 74th Birthday --- ~~and a day, therefore,~~ when all their thoughts and ours were of the homeland across the Atlantic which they had left. A new contingent of Canadians has just arrived in Britain --- the largest of this war --- as a guarantee of Canada's increasing part in the struggle.

After presenting the Colours, His Majesty reminded them that here in Britain they were defending their own shores just as much as ours.

In the midst of war it was a ceremony that brought to mind the memories of peace. But the colours themselves were the only objects of colour in a parade that was in war-uniform --- and at war strength.

Here's another visitor from Canada --- the Dominion's Air Minister, Mr. C.G. Power. ~~The Minister~~ ^{He} is in Britain to discuss air problems with the Ministry; ~~and Service Chiefs~~, he will also visit Canadian Air Force units stationed in this country.

Canada has also been at No. 10 Downing Street in the person of the Pensions Minister, ~~Mr. J. L. ...~~. The occasion was the presentation to Mr. Winston Churchill of the Canadian Victory Loan Torch, with a scroll signed by Mayors of the chief towns in the Dominion. It was a tribute to the work of the Prime Minister in the war effort, and the torch, like the work, was pretty solid.
