For a time Galway swept Kerry off their feet, and the latter's defence was kept constantly on the alert. Soon Galway ~~Then Kerry obtained the opening point~~ scored their first point. Galway forwards saw plenty of the ball, while Kerry front line was mastered by the Galway defenders. Then Galway put through another point. Before many minutes had elapsed, Galway the Western boys scored yet another point, making them two points ahead. Gradually, however, Kerry found their feet and at the interval the score was level -- 4 points each.

On changing ends, Galway made a business-like start, scoring two points in the opening minutes.

Then a great run by o'Gorman brought a Kerry point. *Kerry kept up the attack,* Moments of tense excitement followed, and shortly there developed the movements leading to o'Connors goal for Kerry with a grand shot from a difficult angle.

An overhead point for Kerry followed, and the game was over. *Came just before the end of the game*
