Next on to St.Paul's --- our proud Cathedral that stood like a rock throughout the worst of London's blitzes. We're proud of this place; because it stands like a symbol of all our people in all our cities and towns and villages who stood up to bombing for so long.

Tondon's well-and compident woman who radiates goodwill and comradeship. We're proud to welcome among us the wife of the President of the United States --- wife of that very great man Franklin D. Roosevelt; even when all the world thought we'd lost this war --- never by word or deed did the Roosevelts let down.
