The Prime Minister had a triumphal arise through the streets when he visited Bradford to inspect that great city's war work. He was accompanied by Mr. Bevin and the Air Minister and by Mrs. Churchill and their daughter in the A.T.S. --- Second Subaltern Mary Churchill. Mr. Churchill spoke from the Town Hall about the recent Allied victories.
