Our newsreel camera's record from all over the world includes this week the latest pictures from New Guinea. American soldiers making their first contact with the Japanese near Buna. It's one of the fronts where the United Nations are advancing --- though here as everywhere else there's a long way to travel.

KISKA BOMBING.

Kiska --- across the Pacific in the Aleutian Isles there's a rainbow. But it's a rainbow that heralds a shower of bombs for the Rising Sun. American warplanes are blasting Japanese positions on this stepping stone to Japan.

L'ORIENT.

Britain --- another unit of the U.S. Army Air Force operating against the Axis --- this time in Europe. These heavy bombers took part in the recent raid on the German submarine base at L'Orient --- the crews suffered some casualties, but the Huns and U-Boats suffered/ More.

HONGKONG BOMBED.

China --- Another American air base, operating against Japan. Part of the American Army Air Force ⁱⁿ ~~operating in~~ China hops the desolate mountain wilderness to visit Hongkong. Over the objective their bombs hurtle downwards towards the Japanese headquarters.

U.S. WARSHIPS SINK JAPANESE PATROL BOATS.
