Latest pictures from Tunisia come from the Mateur front where activity has been somewhat restricted recently. Some of the wounded in the action by Green Hill were being helped back to Advance Dressing Stations. This is General Anderson who commands the 1st Army --- a tough job. Some prisoners have been taken at the Gendarmerie, to be sent back to Headquarters.

GOLD COAST.

Gold Coast--- sappers of the Gold Coast Regiment training in the important job of getting transport across rivers. Since this war started we've seen many pictures of making pontoon bridges and crossing streams in collapsible boats. Undoubtedly it's a vital adjunct of military tactics: but there's no doubt that when we get to Venice it'll seem like a home from home.

These are the first pictures from Dakar, taken by permission of the War ~~Empire~~ Department....Dakar the important West African port that has been saved from falling into Axis hands. The Governor General is M. Pierre Boisson; but it's better to say too little than too much about the former Vichy Empire: nobody wants another outbreak of political confusion.
