THE FAR EAST FRONT --- PATROL ACTION IN BURMA. 6/4/43

These are the first pictures from Burma since troops of the British Empire began pushing the Japanese back on the Mayu Peninsular. It is the area of Akyab and Arakan; Indian troops are sharing with Home Regiments the difficulties of this jungle war. These are the men who are doing the job of rejoining this important neighbour of India and China -- and the Burma Police are already back at work. This theatre of war is yet another where the supply question is of supreme importance --- and such great difficulty
