Smoke envelopes the slopes of Monastery Hill at Cassino; after the long period of lull in Italy, men, guns and tanks have gone over to the offensive. In a wide scale attack by the Fifth Army and the Eighth Army, the first objectives were carried and the advance went on; these are the first newsreel pictures back from the Southern front in Europe; the first move was the surprise crossing of the Rapido River.

Casualties were inevitable, against the strongly-held defence positions; but far greater casualties were inflicted on the Germans—and in addition some thousands of new prisoners were taken; a big defeat was inflicted on Hitler's crack paratroop regiment

The assault continues. Part of the success of the Allied attack was due to the strangling of enemy communications; this is one of the thousands of air attacks on enemy railways and bridges and if you never before believed in precision bombing, watch this bridge at the last of the allied.
