

GERMANS IN MOSCOW.

They told the world they would get to Moscow --- and now they've got there. Over fifty seven thousand German soldiers captured by the Red Army in one campaign in White Russia. Major General von Erdmandorf --- Commandant of Mogilev

Major General Klamat, commanding 260th Infantry Division.

General Feldkars, commanding 27th German Armoured Corps.

General Golvitser, 53rd Armoured Corps.

Major General Engel, 45th Infantry Division.

Major General Schmidt, head of the 9th Army

Engineer Service.

Nineteen German Generals altogether. Now they are to march as captives along the streets of Moscow, through which they hoped to march in triumph. *leading them was a Russian General*

A sorry collection of brigands they look, watched by the people of Moscow whom they were planning to enslave

So ends, for them, another German dream of conquest. This in the east of Europe, compares with what British and Americans are doing to German armies in the West.
