THE WESTERN FRONT --- LATEST PICTURES FROM NIJMEGEN AND DUNKIRK.

The corridor between Eindhoven and Nijmegen on the Holland front is one of the key points of the Allied positions in Europe. Here a bridge has been constructed over the Wilhelmina Canal; and the weight of our attacks-in-the-making is slowly being huilt up. This particular bridge was built by American Airborne troops from material found on the spet; the tools they used were borrowed from nearby houses; this proves that our fighting forces are notirely dependent on superior supplies.

These pictures were taken in one of the most critical sectors of the Holland position; the Allied road had been cut more than once; Cerman guns were still within range. But the mighty task of massing men and material goes on.

Another new gun joins the action on the side of the United Nations; 7.2. Just off the secret list, we can now show them in action in Europe

Now to Dunkirk; this name that will be engraved on far more hearts than ever ancient Calais was. This time, it's the Germans who are about to get out. But first there is another of those truces that we have granted at the Channel port sieges --- to enable civilians to evacuate before the final onslaught. A Brigade Major discusses the terms with a German Control Officer. Their expressions make an interesting study.
