America's Department of Defence has just released these films of the Navy's newest guided missile - the "Regulus". A jet-driven weapon, it can be launched from submarines as well as surface-ships, and travels to its target at supersonic speeds.

As you can see by these pictures of the take-off, an initial push is supplied by booster-jets.

When in flight, the "Regulus" can be guided to the target by escort-planes which keep in radio-contact with its electronic brain.

In war-time, the "Regulus" would be despatched direct to its target.

But this experimental model is fitted with landing-gear and a parachute brake so that the mother plane can bring her charge safely back to base.
