Gone was the atmosphere of despair that for eighteen months had hovered over the Korean truce village of Panmunjom. And hope was high as Communist reporters and truce delegates arrived for the final Conference on the exchange of sick and wounded prisoners.

Rear-Admiral John Daniel led the United Nations' liason group into the building While, from the next ridge, came the distant sounds of war - a grim reminder that men were still dying on the Peninsula, and that this meeting could point the way to an armistice.

So - against this background - the agreement was signed.
