Into London Airport comes an Flizabethan sirliner - with a very important passenger on board - it's Sir Winston Churchill who is welcomed home by Sir John dalbiac - Commandant of the Airport.

After his short holiday in the South of France, the Premier looked fit and well and ready for work, as he walked to his mairing car where Lady Churchill was waiting inside to greet him

Soon after - another airport arrival was Mr Anthony Eden - who has been convalencing in Greece after his recent operation. The Foreign WAS ASKED WHETHER HE WOULD MAKE A SKNOWNE RETURN TO Secretary stressed that he, too, was ready for work. SOUND WORK.

And now comes news - fallowing a full-scale Cabinet Meeting, which was (attended by the Foreign Secretary and other Ministers) that Mr Eden resumes his post at the Foreign Office.

At Portsmouth, a reception was held aboard H.M.S. Victory - Nelsen's famous flag-ship - for delegates of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation.

The visitors, were, of course, escorted around the ship - not gorgetting the spot where Nelson fell, mortally wounded, in the hour of victory at Trafalgar.

The delegates, (who form the Council of Permanent Representatives of the Organisation) were visiting Britain in connection with "Exercise Mariner" - the full-scale Naval Operation in which three hundred warships have taken part.
