Marie is renouncing the world for a life of meditation and prayer, as she joins one of the most cloistered Orders of the Catholic Faith (BRING NP)

New York Horse Show--

America - where a team of the celebrated red-coated Canadian "Mounties" provide a star turn - a musical ride at the National Horse Show in New York (BRING UP)

thrilling finale came in the Four-Nations Jumping Tests, when Britain's ace horsewoman, Pat Smythe, completed a perfect round in 40 seconds (BRING UP)

But Canada's 18 year-old Shirley Thomas took one second less, and so won the International Challenge Trophy (BRING UP)

And Mr Attlee - followed by High Commissioners and representatives of the Colonies and Protectorates. (ER ING UP)
