A tragic end - patents shared by many other fine vessels - perhaps through sabotage or just carelessness?

Remember the 3 Atlantique - burnt out in the channel, twenty years ago?

And in 1939, the 357000 ton "Paris" gutted at Le Harve? There sabotage
was suspected.

A third great French liner, the Normandic was a war-time victim in New York - after being converted into a Navy Auxiliary.

More recently, at Harwich, the "Kron prins Frederik" Happily, she will sail again. But not the "Empress of Canada" Inxiladataxaax Rock, haginaxaax
