The Mayor started the fifty riders on the great marathon event - over 1460 miles - through 33 counties Refreshments were taken on route - during this first stage of 128 miles from Great Yarmouth to Lincoln.

An early spill put Arthur Broncksert of Belgium, out of the race At the end of the opening day, Germain Mercier of France led the caralcade into Lincoln - to become the first man to wear the Race Leader's coveted yellow jersey
