Spanish Fire Escape

Spain: When the Barcelona Fire Brigade received their new fire-fighting equipment - a newsreel cameraman decided to sample the ups and downs of a fireman's life on the <sup>GIANT</sup> automatic fire escape.

The ascent is made in a metal turret, which enables the fireman to devote his full attention to the blaze. The escape is 175 ft high and dwarfs the statue of Christopher Columbus.
