America: A good tonic for a famous patient. Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery visits the Fitzsimmons Army Hospital, at Denver, to see his old friend, President Eisenhower.

Paris: Following his reinstatement as Sovereign, the Sultan of Morocco awaits his return to the Protectorate.

Allied Landings commemorated

North Africa: On the 13th anniversary of the Allied Landings in World War Two, the Governor-General of Algeria, M. Soustelle, unveiled a monument in Algiers - commemorating the history invasion.

The ceremony was attended by resistance groups, of which the Gov. General was one of the leading organisers.

Atom station

Scotland: First Newsreel pictures of the nuclear power reactor, now being constructed at Dounreay, Caithness. One advanced type (known as the a "breeder reactor" because it produces more fuel than it consumes) will giant be housed in a/steel sphere - to ensure complete safety.
