## Veterans Cars: On the Road to Brighton

London: All of a tremble and eager to go - some of the world's oldest cars left Hyde Park on the annual R.A.C. Veteran Car Run to Brighton. The Rally celebrates the Amancipation Day Run of 1896. Up to that time horseless carriages (as they were called) had to be led by a man with a DOME STILL red flag., Angry pedestrians aften think it's a pity the law was ever changed . Westminster Bridge - and here's a casualty.2 Hey! You can't park here there's an R in the month. Altogether, 194 cars set out for the coast - all of them over fifty years old. And except for the occasional helping hand up the steepest hills only seven failed to finish the 56 mile course in the allotted time. The run along the Brighton Road enabled the R.A.C. to try out its atesi innovation to the exercises -"the aerial patrol" - a helicopter that radioed details of traffic bottlenecks to mobile PATRoLS.
