Tokyo: Angry Japanese fishermen gathered around the Korean Diplomatic Mission to protest against their exclusion from international fishing-grounds.

~~Representatives of the fishermen~~ ^{The fishermen's spokesmen} stated their case to the diplomats - explaining how the ~~recent~~ extension of territorial waters by Korea - had taken in one of the richest fishing-grounds in the area.
