## Aviation: British Planes for the World

Germany: Already on order for sixteen countries, the Bristol "Britannia" turbo-prop airliner leads Britain's cerial challenge to world markets, as she arrives at Hamburg - on a six-day European Sales Drive. Meanwhile, another British plane has found favour in Japan - the Vempire Jet Trainer - being demonstrated by test pilot George Errington. After the flight, the plane was officially handed over - to help the build-up of the newly-created Jepanese air Force.
