Old Trafford: Needing only one more victory, England's hopes of retaining those Ashes rose sky-high when Skipper Peter May won the toss and took first knock on a perfect batting wicket. England amateurs, Richardson and Cowdrey opened the innings, and hit xtraightranay their Nottingham century-stand form - from the start . courteen runs off the first three overs Better equipped in attacking-strokes, Cowdrey was first to reach his fifty - which included nine boundaries, Richardson, too, kept the scoreboard moving, despite superb fielding by the Aussies.
