June won the 220 yards, too, -a great double;

And with a winning jump of five feet six inches, Thelma Hopkins reached Gold Medal standard - in the last big test before Melbourne.

Often unnoticed at subletic meetings, Throwing the Hammer proved a fiery spectacle, especially when Joszef Csermak, the 1952 Olympic Champion, threw the illuminated ball 195 ft. 8 inches.

Farly hopes of victory in the 100 Metres turned to dismay, when Champion John Young fell, while leading, with a torn muscle.

The winner was Hungarian star, Jakabfy .but there's good news - Young should be fit for Helbourns.

Thrill followed thrill, especially in the 5,000 Metres. In the last lap, the famous Szabo looked the winner. But watch Frank Sando (No. 2), snatch a dramatic victory - right on the tape.

Once again, Sando's never-say-die spirit had triumphed.

The 1500 metres proved another tremendous fillip - with Derek Ibbotson GATTLING WOOT WITH

And at the tape - Ibbotson was leading...by inches...

A great London victory that inspires confidence for those sterner battles shead.
