Often unnoticed at <sup>these</sup> athletic meetings, ~~the~~ Throwing the Hammer proved a fiery spectacle, especially when Joszef Csermak, the 1952 Olympic Champion, threw the illuminated ball 195 ft. 8 inches. /

Early hopes of victory in the 100 Metres turned to dismay, when Champion John Young fell, while leading, with a torn muscle.

The winner was Hungarian star, Jakabfy. ~~but there's good news - Young should be fit for Melbourne.~~

Thrill followed thrill, especially in the 5,000 Metres. In the last lap, the famous Szabo looked the winner. But watch Frank Sando (No. 2), snatch ~~a~~ a dramatic victory - right on the tape. /

Once again, Sando's never-say-die spirit had triumphed. /

The 1500 metres proved another tremendous fillip - with Derek Ibbotson - <sup>BATTLING IT OUT WITH</sup> ~~No. 1-~~ Laszlo Tabori, the four minute miler. /

And at the tape - Ibbotson was ~~leading~~ leading....by inches...

A great London victory that inspires confidence for those sterner battles ahead. /
