

Egypt-- Following the decisions of the United Nations, Israeli troops (with their vehicles, heavy guns, and mortars), continued their withdrawal from the Sinai Desert- at a distance roughly 30 miles from the Canal Zone.

The plans for this operation had been discussed <sup>AT THE COAST TOWN OF EL ARISH,</sup> by General Burns, Commander of the United Nations Emergency Force.
