A battle-royal was assured at Twickenham when the Queen and Prince Philip joined 72,000 Rugby enthusiasts - for the "match of the season". Before the kick-off, the Duke congratulated England on their unbeaten record... And, no doubt, wished Scotland a change of ~~xxxxxxx~~ fortune: their last victory, at Twickenham, was in 1938. Scotland (in dark jerseys) kicked off. England replied with a passing movement that set the pattern for some brilliant, attacking Rugby. By resolute tackling, <sup>SCOTLAND</sup> ~~England~~ held out until Butterfield's great burst gave Davies the first try <sup>FOR ENGLAND.</sup>

In the second half, England increased their lead to six points, through a penalty by Challis.

But honours here went to full-back <sup>Ken</sup> ~~Ken~~ Scotland - who replied with a terrific fifty-yard penalty.

*But* that was Scotland's last fling. The England pack now dominated the game. And first, Thompson hurled himself over in the corner.

Challis added the goal points. England eleven. Scotland three. Poor Scotland wilted, as England made it a grand slam triumph.

The Calcutta Cup, the Triple Crown and the Championship <sup>were</sup> ~~was~~ theirs - long before Higgins scored the third try.

The conversion by Challis was a mere formality. England had won by sixteen points to three - and with Skipper Eric Evans shoulder high - they rounded off their greatest season since 1928.
