Britons on trial

In Cairo - the four Britons, who with eleven Egyptians and one Yugoslav, are accused of spying for Britain against Egypt - made a brief appearance in court.

Despite having been in custody for seven months, the four men looked in reasonably good health. After a preliminary hearing, the Chief defence lawyer, Ahmed Rushdi, and Example, asked for a postponement of the case to enable him to study the charges. The request was granted.
