Electronics exhibition

Manchester: The striking advance in the use of science to aid greater industrial production was a feature of the Electronics Exhibition and Convention.

One exhibit was the "Atomat" which (by using a radio-active isotope) measures the constancy of materials.

In plastic manufacture - the needle and cotton are out. To-day, an automatic welder (driven by an electronic generator) presses out mittens in a single operation.
