Arriving at Bangor for her three-day visit to Northern Ireland, Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother stepped ashore on the spot where she landed as Duchess of York- 34 years ago.

Her Majesty was welcomed by the Governor- Lord Wakehurst, who presented the Prime Minister- Viscount Brockeborough.

The girst engagement was a visit to the National Conference of the British Legion (Women's Section) where the Queen Mother was greeted by Dame Regina Evans- Chairman of the Conference.

Then a five-mile drive to Newtownards, where a tremendous reception awaited awaited the Queen Mother at the civic centre. Here nurses from the Ards Hospital, the Red Cross, and the St John Ambulance Brigade lined up for the Reyal laying of the foundation waxx stone

Of now to Belfast, where Her Majesty was the guest of honour at a Civic Luncheon in the City Hall. She was greeted by the Lord Mayor, Alderman McKee, and members of the Council.

A company of over four hundred guests, representative of the State, the Church, the Services, industry and commerce paid Belfast's own tribute to their Royal Guest.

From the City Hall, the Queen Mother drove to Stormont for a Parliamentary reception and garden party in the grounds of Government House.

On the Air Station, Her inity Majesty reviewed units of the Territorial Army, in Northern Ireland.
