- 9, M.S. General Eisenhower. 9
- 10, V.S. Small group of people in English public house standing around radio. The S.O.F. is of General Eisenhower announcing the Italian surrender. The group of people raise their glasses and cheer. 130
- 11, V.S. Ships of the Italian fleet make for allied ports after instructions from Admiral Cunningham. 33
- 12, M.S. British infantry moving along road. 22
- 13, M.S. Group of smiling British and American soldiers. 11
