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THE RUSSIAN OFFENSIVE.

The sweeping success of the Russian summer offensive is now so firmly established, that in the opinion of many observers, German withdrawal, particularly in the E Ukraine, South to the Sea of Azof, has now become the greatest retreat in Military history. Through swampland swollen by heavy rains the Russians press on, ploughing stubbornly forward through the Donetz Basin in their drive toward the Dnieper River. Kursk, Ryelgorod and Taganrog are now far behind as the Red Army wins back village after village.

Nazi night raiders run into heavy anti-aircraft fire as they seek to prise the Russians loose from their positions.

Wrecked equipment marks the road of the German route at Taganrog and Mariupol.

Russian successes around Smolensk robbed the Nazis of hundreds of locomotives. This is the nearest Russian-held point so far to Poland. Ever westward roll the Soviet Armies.

The deepest penetrations yet made into the 1941 German line have been the fruits of Marshal Stalin's brilliant offensive.

On toward the Dnieper, while the threat to German-held Kiev grows almost hourly. Nazi attempts to consolidate are smashed, as the forced German exodus from Russia is hastened before the approaching winter.

Burning the Nazis out of fortifications they've held for two years. Flame throwers which cremate every living thing in their path. The German army is facing the most perilous crisis of its history. If the present allied pressure is maintained, it will face disaster.

Hitler's "Master Race" is being rooted out of Russia's earth. What Germany has brought to the Soviet may very well be the lot of the Third Reich.

When the invasion of Germany is made, from the east will come the consummation of Josef Stalin's plan, "Extermination and death to the German invaders, their State, their Army, their "New Order in Europe".
