WOOD FOR WAR.

Deep in the Canadian Forests, lumberjacks are cutting great stands of Douglas Fir to provide more timber for war industries. The demand for wood is a heavy one. Ancient trees in Dominion Forests fall to the blades of the Canadian Forestry Corps.

Every tree of suitable girth is a conscript for war. These 500 year old giants of the forest are producing some two billion feet of lumber a year. Trainloads are hauled out of the hills to travel down river to the sawmills.
