

WITH CHURCHILL IN EGYPT.

Under extreme pressure of work, Mr.Churchill made time to visit his old regiment. With his son and daughter, ^{Captain} Randolph Churchill and Section-Leader Oliver, ^(Sidney Churchill?) the Prime Minister reviewed the 4th Queen's Own Hussars (the regiment of which he is Colonel-in-Chief) at a desert site within easy distance of Cairo.

The squadrons of Tanks and their crews were drawn up in a long open line, two deep.

There's the familiar rush to gain the front row when Mr.Churchill addresses the men. The first time he met the Regiment in the Middle East was a short while before the great Alamein advance. He recalled the 250 years tradition of the Regiment, and said how pleased he was that in this war the 4th Queen's Own had made a worthy, honourable and outstanding contribution. Here were massive arrays of fighting men and armour which, Mr.Churchill announced, would soon be increased.

At this time when great decisions were being taken we show you the first pictures of the third momentous Conference. Mr.Churchill and Mr.Roosevelt entered into Council with the great leader of the Turkish Republic, President Inonu. The Turkish delegates had come at the pressing invitation

of the British, American and Soviet Governments.

There was manifest need for consultation with friendly Turkey, whose prudent foreign policy has constituted a rock of stability in the Near and Middle East. The strain of Business on Mr. Churchill has been severe. His Health is our concern.
