### TWO-ARMY LINK-UP IN ITALY.

On this road reconnaissance units from the main 5th Army battle line and the Anzio beachhead met for the first time when the link-up between the two Armies was made. Thus ended the 12 1/2 days of isolation for the men at ANZIO... and the signal for the great energy massed there to be unleashed in the combined offensive on Rome. Rush newsreel pictures from Italy bring you the scene on the road when British and American soldiers from both sides joined forces and joined hands.

Among those recording the happy moment with their cameras is AMERICAN Army cameraman IRENBURG of Detroit, and his opposite number in the British Army, Sgt. Bagget.

General Mark Clark drove out the same miles or so to the meeting place to add his words of congratulation. The telephone link between both fronts is joined and bound together with a handshake. The roadside scene is a matter of history now, but there's a footnote to the story. Three members of the Army Film Unit made a 90 mile car dash back to Naples with these pictures of the meeting. Entering the City they got nabbed by a speed cop. But they made it and you get your pictures.
