

LAW AND ORDER IN ROME.

Law and order have been quickly established in Rome through the efficient agency of the Allied Military Government Public Safety Organisation. Several hundred Italian police, enlisted into a special force have, after a period of instruction, now been assigned duties in the Capital. It was way back before the days of the Anzio landings that General Eisenhower approved the establishment and training of these Carabinieri in preparation for the day when the Allies enter Rome. They were recruited from Sardinia, Bari and Southern Provinces of Italy. They work in close co-ordination with our own Military Police.

A few of Rome's Fascist firebrands find themselves behind bars. The disbanding of Political agencies and the incarceration of enemy collaborators is also entrusted to the new Carabinieri.
