Exclusive Pathe coverage of the Cambridgeshire at Ascot.... "Fun Fair," with Gordon Richards in the saddle, draws an outside position; while "Advocate," (who, with "Fun Fair," dominated the market on the race) is on the Grandstand side.

"Fun Fair" races with the group on the outside, while "Advocate" gallops almost <u>under</u> the stand rails; but, for a long way it is hard for the growd to see which horse is in the load.

"Advecate" loses his place to "Sheunington," and "Fun Fair" moves up to take the lead from "Giraud" and win by a head. "Sheunington" only a neck behind "Giraud," takes third place.

For the second year in succession, "Fun Fair" is led in as winner of the Ascot Gambridgeshire.

Now the Cesarewitch....15 therebreds racing over the two miles for the 1,000 guineas prize money.

"Cadet" takes the lead quite early in the race and is never seriously challenged except when "The Towkay" moves up....ealy to break down a mile from the finish.

"Misty Morning," (an outsider ridden by the apprentice Dilling who rode "Giraud" to second place in the Cambridgeshire) closes with "Cadet" and gains another second place; "Milling" finishing third. Many found a popular double at this meeting when Mr. Barrington's "Cadet" was led in as the winner.
