DRAMATIC INTERNATIONAL AT WEMBLEY

90,000 out of the 350,000 who came to Wembley, pack the Empire Stadium. The lucky ones saw history made. Scotland set the pace from the start with masterly play. Their strategy and skilful defence tactics shut down on the English attacks. King Haakon of Norway watched from the Royal Box.
