On the perimeter of German-held Dunkirk captured rocket-shells are put to good use by members of a Czechoslovak unit. After a few experiments they bombard the Germans with their own ammunition. This type rocket is aimed and fired direct from the container.

Dunkirk, one of these isolated citadels left behind in Europe by the receding tide of German conquest, gets a hammering from Canadian gunners.

Says a War Reporter, "It's getting so bad in Dunkirk, that on one occasion a German was spotted going down the road on a bicycle. One shot was fired and there was no bicycle and no Jerry."

On these Forgotten Fronts the German garrisons are thrown away in fighting that can only end in surrender or total destruction.
