NEW GOVERNOR OF JERSEY

After five years of German occupation and ninety days of British military rule the Channel Islands get back to normal. A naval launch brings Jersey's new Lieutenant Governor to the island, the first to be appointed since the Germans were kicked out: Canadian born Lieutenant-General Sir Arthur Grasett.

Officers commanding British troops in Jersey and a Royal Artillery Guard of Honour were drawn up on Albest Pier to greet the new Lieutenant Governor.

Later in the day, General and Lady Grasett took a look around their new home at Government House. The General headed the European-contacts section on General Eisenhower's staff at Shaef. Now he takes over in Britain's oldest overseas possessions.
