DYNAMOS DRAW WITH RANGERS

Glasgow turned on a characteristically Hielan welcome when the Moscow Dynamo invaded Ibrox Park to meet the Rangers. The 90,000 crowd were in for a treat, recalling the days when Scotsmen were considered the supreme footballers. Fourth match in the Dynamo's triumphal tour, this was the first time their opponents earned those much discussed bouquets. Dynamo's sequence of a draw and two wins set Rangers the task of saving the reputation of British football and they went into the match determined to do just that. Moscow's star team was quickly off the mark - their ball control and pin-point passing kept the Scots defence guessing. It paid dividends too. A goal in two minutes.

Scotland brightened up five minutes before the interval. Jimmy Smith scrambled through to score.

After the turn round, the Dynamo blew a fuse. Still playing top-line football, they wilted under a terrific hammering Ranger's seemed all set on striking a blow for Bonny Scotland.

Star of the Russian side was Tiger Khomich - living up to his nickname. Things got rough towards the end. A foul by the Dynamo skipper, Semichastny, gave Rangers a second penalty chance - Young did the scoring. Not world beaters, but a magnificent team, Dynamo should visit us again next year.
