150 feet below divers prepare to resp a rich, underseas
barvest. This fleet of two hundred boats in the Gulf
of Mexico aims to bring up three million a year. Working
below the surface divers range wide areas to rake in the
sponges. Fouled air lines and attacks by sharks make
sponge diving a hazardous compation.

The natural sponges are mashed to press out foreign matter.
