Car racing rears back into the headlines as the famous Rice Grand Prix brings cloven high powered speciations back on the reads. Cars in the 15 to 25 a.c class burn up the surface of the Presence des Anglaia. A course of 130 miles, it packs 65 turns and brings Europe's ace wheelmen back to the old thrills of the mos. Out in front were Villerest in an Alfa Remo and Semmer in a Maserati - famous names that helped to make the Rice Grand Prix one of motings biggest drams.

Semmer notched the best speed on the turns with 70 miles an hour and some second. Winning average was Villerent's 65 miles an hour - good going round those 65 bends.
