

TOJO ON TRIAL

One-time strong man of Japan, Ex-Premier Tojo heads the 27 Jap War Criminals indicted before a Tokyo version of the Nuremberg Trial. Prominent with his conspicuous praying is Shumei Okawa, the man who touched off Japan's Manchuria invasion on Tojo's orders in 1931. Justice took 15 years to strike back. Now it has Okawa in tears.
