SOMERSET'S ROWAN RELICS

In a Somerset field at Low Hem the centuries rell back as archeologists unsever an almost perfect example of a villa built mearly 2,000 years age. Once the home of a wealthy Roman, the villas magnificent messic floor was buried under 2 feet of earth. Even in this atomic age, the richness and grace of the messics are of great significance in the recording of Britain's long history.
