Under alouded skies and with a near gale blowing, thousands trekted by foot, bigyele, denkey cart and limeusine to Epsen Downs for the revival of a national sporting festival - the first pegt-war Dorby. Goloshes, made and unbrellas were out instead of the usual summer outfits but rain and wind were seen to give way to a burst of June sunshine. Here's the scene at Epsen 1946.

Hours before the race the crewis began to assemble. The factor and honest Joe were there - just begging the racegoers to take their memory. Pearly kings just out of battle-dress and servicemen from all parts of the Empire were enoug watchers who packed the free side from the minning post to fattenham Corner. Wayside lunches at 5 bob a time raked in the memory and there was pleasty of tea but no beer.

Making a day of it, Moson turned on all the fun of the fair - sheding the money up easily - after the race, only the lucky for will have any left,

Back in circulation is Prince "I've-get-a-horse" Monalulu, the feathered character everybody knows. Ah there you are!

Excitement was in the air as the crowd of a quarter of a million packed into line the mils 100 deep and mit for the off.

For the first time in Desky history the King and members of the Reyal family drive in a dosed car down the famous course. A reyal progress from Tattenham Corner to the Grandstand. It's a call for a nighty cheer from the Victory Derky crowds.

With 17 rumers competing for the punters favour, many an expert eye took a last minute check-up in the paddock. Here, they're just homes -but somewhere smong 'on there's a winner. Anxious watchess presented the going "perfect". Said one rider, "It's not too heavy and not too light and we couldn't have a fairer test."

Winning attention in the parade were Lord Berby's GULF STREAM with Harry Wragg up - a hot 5 to 1 favourite at the call over. Big-bened HAPPY KHIGHF, and a 50 to 1 outsider - AIRBORNE - only grey in the race.

And now the line-up, and they're ready - all steady - and they're off. And they're all away in a line - Friar Tuck's well behind and first to nose shead is AIRBORNE with HAPPY KNIGHT and GULF STREAM up alongside. The air's electric now and the Royal enlockers hear the famous Derby roan.

They're pulling out now. AIRBCHER's fall on back - and it's GULF STREAM, HAPPY KNIGHT and HOWARD TUDGE out in front, with PHTERBOROUGH and QUI VA LA looking like good chances. Favourite till the day before the race, HAPPY KHIGHT carries a lot of money. But he's plenty of challengers and it's still smybody's thee.

Up to Tattenhem Commer and it's PHYMEBOROUGH out about now -HAPPY KNIGHT second - GULF STREAM, KHALED - QUI VA LA and FAST AND FAIR all still well in the running.

The page is getting 'em now - and they're battling for a win over the last lung-bursting half mile. GULF SPREAM looked a winer but he's beaten and it's AIRBORNE's race with GULF SPREAM a length behind sedend, and RADIOPHERAPY third.

A great day and a grand race for AIRBORNE. Owned by Mr. Perguson, the calt goes in among the great names of English racing - Victory Berby winner, and a backers dream at 50 smackers to one.
