Cairo's historic citadel was the some of the first step in our evacuation of Egypt. As British troops of the Highland Light Infantry line the Inner Square, fer'd and heavy footed Egyption saldiers take even. Gammanding the coremony was the G.O.C. Egypt, Coneral Allfrey. 20,000 troops and 100,000 tens of supplies have already moved out of Cairo and Alexandria. Epilogue to a chapter of Empire building, with Egyption amy staff chief, EERIK ATTALLAH PASKA stepping into our shoos.

The corresponded handling ever of the keys symbolises the return to Egypt of the fortress which has been a British Barracks for 64 years. Hoisted first in 1882, on this summer day of 1946, the Union Jack is struck for the last time in Egypt.
