If your plane gets into trouble, throw a switch. Next thing you know you're all clear of the parachute-tearing slip stream.

ISLE OF MAN

Packed stands see the Isle of Man's famous Grand Prix race. Last one was in 1939 and the gruelling 226 mile course comes back with a new kick. Junior and lightweight machines compete. Average speeds top 60 miles an hour but the Bradden Bridge Corners keep the pace down.

1600 feet up the hillside is the Bugalow Station hotel spot for spills. Here it comes now - On this same course next day, London rider Aitchison was killed.

From Governor's Corner, to the home stretch and the winner's flag. Maxx Champ of 1946 is Dentist Kenneth Mills of Gillingham, Kent. Speed 74 miles an hour.
