SEPTEMBER:

Dr. Hassen Suthrawardy, D.Sc., M.D., F.R.C.S., D.P.H., first Indian to be appointed honorary Surgeon to the Vicercy of India.

Sir James Jems, brilliant expesitor of science.

Gooffrey de Mavilland, fearless test pilot, (tie-ep 46/79)

COTOBER:

Mr. C.R.W. Nevinson, the versatile artist.

General J.W. Stilwell, one of the greatest authorities on Chinese life and Culture in the United States. Generalizates Chinese Kai-Shek gave him Command of the Chinese Pifth and Sixth Amnies.

Dr. C.S. Myers, piencer psychologist.

Sir Grenville Bentock, companer, conductor and teacher of music. A great and leved figure.

Sir Percy Rates, chairmen of Cumard-White Star line. The men to whom the Queen Elizabeth was a lifetime's dream come type, and who died a few hours before the liner sailed for the United States.

Major-General Sir John Hembury Williams, G.C.V.O., K.C.B., C.M.G., head of the British Hilitary Mission at headquarters of the Russian armies in the 1914-18 war, and first Marshal of the Diplomatic Corps.

Professor Permy P. Frankland. Made valuable investigations in pure chamistry. Described as "one of the few remaining links with Faraday."

NOVEMBER:

Lord Howard de Walden. Hen of property, patren of the arts and sportsmen. He owned most of Harley Street.

Sir Geoffrey Callender, director of the National Maritime Museum, Greenwich, who gave his life to the study of naval history and archaeology of the country.

Sir Neel Mackits, Creator of the plan which gave Britain over 800 small warships to fight the Battle of the Marrow Sees.

Dr. Charles Gatty, composer, who put his best efforts into writing for the stage. His devotion to opera was life-long.

Pendit Maden Mohen Malaviya, piencer of Hindu Matienalies.

Mr. Henry Morgenthau, U.S. Ambassador to Turbey during the early years 1914-18. Represented British interests at Istenbul until his own country came into the war.
