Sir Charles Marston, whose financial help  
enabled a number of expeditions to undertake  
important excavations in Palestine.

Bishop Winnington-Ingram, Bishop of London  
from 1901 to 1939, when he retired. ....37-8

JUNE:

Sir Rollo Graham-Campbell, Chief Magistrate  
of the Police Courts of the Metropolis  
from 1933 to 1940.

SEPTEMBER:

Dr. Hassen Suthrawardy, D.Sc., M.D., F.R.C.S., D.P.H., first Indian to be appointed honorary Surgeon to the Viceroy of India.

Sir James Jeans, brilliant expositor of science.

Geoffrey de Havilland, fearless test pilot. (tie-up 46/79)

OCTOBER:

Mr. G.R.W. Nevinson, the versatile artist.

General J.W. Stilwell, one of the greatest authorities on Chinese life and culture in the United States. Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek gave him command of the Chinese Fifth and Sixth Armies.

Dr. C.S. Myers, pioneer psychologist.

Sir Granville Bantock, composer, conductor and teacher of music. A great and loved figure.

Sir Percy Bates, chairman of Cunard-White Star line. The man to whom the Queen Elizabeth was a lifetime's dream come true, and who died a few hours before the liner sailed for the United States.

Major-General Sir John Hambury Williams, G.C.V.O., K.C.B., C.M.G., head of the British Military Mission at headquarters of the Russian armies in the 1914-18 war, and first Marshal of the Diplomatic Corps.

Professor Percy F. Frankland. Made valuable investigations in pure chemistry. Described as "one of the few remaining links with Faraday."

NOVEMBER:

Lord Howard de Walden. Man of property, patron of the arts and sportsman. He owned most of Harley Street.

Sir Geoffrey Callender, director of the National Maritime Museum, Greenwich, who gave his life to the study of naval history and archaeology of the country.

Sir Noel Macklin, creator of the plan which gave Britain over 800 small warships to fight the Battle of the Narrow Seas.

Dr. Charles Gatty, composer, who put his best efforts into writing for the stage. His devotion to opera was life-long.

Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya, pioneer of Hindu Nationalism.

Mr. Henry Morgenthau, U.S. Ambassador to Turkey during the early years 1914-18. Represented British interests at Istanbul until his own country came into the war.
