The 29 year old Middleser batman, Arsenal and England footballer, is the first crickster to get 1,000 runs this year. His was a fighting innings - probably the greatest of his career. Denis Compton played his first Test Hatch them he was 19, also seering a century. With his score at 163, he was caught by Mitchell from a ball by Mann. His record stand of 237 with his skipper, Noman Yardley, saved England from defeat. The 32 year old Yorkshireman played a real captain's game. Scering 99, he had bad luck them he was caught by Tuchett. It was his first Test in England after his great Australian performance. Compton and Yardley with Kent's Gedfray Evans, saved England from a humilisting defeat. At Lords the position may be different.
